



## MSc Hearing, Balance and Communication

Programme content includes the nature and aetiologies of hearing and balance disorders in the paediatric and elderly population; behavioural and objective assessment of hearing loss in children and adults; cochlear implants and implantable devices, as well as habilitation for adults, including those with complex needs. A further unique focus of the course is the nature and management of tinnitus and hyperacusis.

Alongside mandatory modules, there are a range of elective modules allowing students to tailor their studies to their own professional and personal interests.
